



Requirements for the Construction of Monuments

All proposed work is subject to approval from Council

Applications are made by completing an "Application for Memorial Stone" form, pay relevant fees and charges and apply prior to commencing any work (**Council does not recommend any individual Monumental Mason, however we can provide a list if requested**)

- On receipt of application, the chosen Monumental Mason will need to contact Council for approval
- Once Council has granted approval, fees have been paid, work can commence
- Council will only grant approval with the consent of the Exclusive Right of Burial owner, (proof of purchase and ownership must be supplied at the time)

All final work must be approved by Council

Council does not recommend or endorse any Monumental Mason. Council takes no responsibility for choice of Monumental Mason or any work carried out by them.

GUIDELINES

- Unauthorised kerbing, edging, brick work, timber, tiles, glass, stones, pebbles, garden arches or ferrous material cannot be placed on or around the perimeter of any grave
- No glass, pottery, ceramic container/vases and solar lights with spikes are to be placed on graves or within the Cemetery nonbreakable vases are allowed, however only in permitted areas
- Plants, trees or shrubs are prohibited on or around graves, other than existing landscape of cemetery
- Pebbles, stones, bark, pine chips or ornaments are not to be placed on the grave and may be removed for safety or access reasons
- Council reserves the right to remove without notice any unauthorised ornaments, planting or works which do not comply
- Council will not be liable for future maintenance, care, conservation, preservation or restoration of the construction of monumental surrounds and headstones erected or placed on a grave
- Proof of purchase and ownership of grave is required prior to building on a burial site
- Proof of Australian residency prior to purchase of a grave
